Objective

• Become familiar with different forms of target words.

What you need

• Student worksheet (see next page)

What to do

- 1. Look at the student worksheet and talk about the words from the word list, then help students place the words in the correct spaces using word length as a check on accuracy.
- 2. Have them complete the exercise in pairs or as a class group. Give help with any unknown words if it is needed. Once they have agreed on the correct answers, have them read the sentences aloud. Explain that they may often be able to make corrections to their work by reading aloud to test whether it 'sounds right'.
- 3. Read the words and sentences together. Ask guestions:
 - In what way does 'special' look different from 'specially'?
 - Can you see any other words that end the same way?
 - Can you work out why they have a similar ending?

Extending the activity

- Draw the students' attention to different forms of words they find when they are reading or using the internet.
- Allow them to form their own hypotheses about the reasons for word changes and discuss any atypical forms.
