Text Structure - Poem

Title

Irregular lines
(free verse)

FROST

He leaves frosty frozen prints wherever he goes,

Poetic devices

Use of alliteration, e.g. frosty frozen

Use of personification, e.g. Frost is a man clothed in white.

Use of rhyme, e.g. goes, toes

Use of onomatopoeia, e.g. plop, plop

lines)

Language Features

Regular rhythm and rhyme

Regular pattern (question and answer)
