Nouns:
 Proper nouns e.g. Ms Rogers
 Common nouns e.g. sport, staffroom

Prepositions:
 Of place across, in, on, between etc., e.g. in the staffroom
 Of accompaniment with etc., e.g. with my friends

Articles:
 Definite the, e.g. the staffroom
 Indefinite a, an, e.g. an appointment
 Omission of article before most proper nouns, with uncountable nouns e.g. on Tuesday, You can only do powerwalking.

Pronouns:
 Subject I, you, we etc., e.g. I don't like volleyball
 Possessive your, her, my etc., e.g. my friends

Conjunctions:
 Additive and etc., e.g. You need to go and see Ms Rogers.
 Causal because, so etc., e.g. Because I was away, I didn't choose volleyball.

Adjectives:
 different, full, late etc., e.g. Most sports are full.

Adverbs:
 Of place away, here, there etc., e.g. I was away.
 Of focus only, even etc., e.g. You can only do powerwalking.

Question formation:
 'wh' e.g. Where is Ms. Rogers?
 subject reversal e.g. Can't I do soccer with my friends?
 'do' support when no auxiliary e.g. I don't like volleyball.
Negation: e.g. I didn't choose volleyball.
Short answer forms: e.g. Yes, I have. No, I haven't. Yes, you can. No, you can't.
Present tense verbs: e.g. She's in the staffroom.
Past tense verbs: e.g. I was away.
Future tense verbs: e.g. I'll stay in volleyball.
Imperative verbs: e.g. You need to go and see Ms Rogers.
Modals: could, might, may, would etc., e.g. You can only do powerwalking
Simple contractions: what's, I'm, it's, she's etc., e.g. I didn't choose volleyball
