



he talaage e Carla ki a ia.











Ko e vali ago, vali lanu moana,

lanu fuamoli ke he pepe ago.




Kua pehē atu a Carla,






Carla passed out little tins of paint.

Carla told her.







"Carla, can you help me with my shirt?"

Carla went to help her.




Alisa decided to try yellow.

and drew a butterfly.




"This is too plain," Alisa thought.

Alisa gasped.




Alisa painted another yellow butterfly.

Alisa thought really hard.




"Carla, when I mix yellow and blue together,
