Haere Atu!:

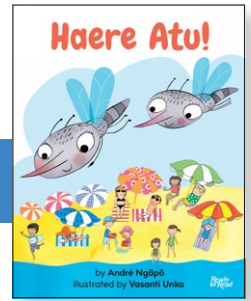
- connects to students' lives
